1. This Association will not be responsible for any loss, damage or theft of any exhibit. This being a condition of entry, all care is taken, but no responsibility.
2. **PHOTOGRAPHY** and **FINE ARTS** exhibits must be delivered to **Wondai Regional Art Gallery** by **12noon Monday 28th August 2017**.
3. Exhibitors should endeavour to have **ALL OTHER ENTRIES** finalised by **8pm Thursday 31st August 2017**.
4. The Secretary's Office will be open at the Showgrounds 9am to 4pm Monday 28th August – Wednesday 30th August and late (till 8pm) Thursday 31st August to allow for lodgement of Entry Forms, payment of entry monies and collection of Entry Tickets. If you are unable to go to the Showgrounds before Friday, you can phone the Office (phone: 4168 5684 show week) and lodge your entries so tickets can be ready for collection.
5. Non perishable exhibits can be delivered on Thursday 31st August, ready for judging the following morning.
6. **Limited processing of entries will be available 6.00am- 8.30am on the Friday morning**, especially for perishable exhibits (Sections 5, 6, 7 and 8 – Farm Produce, Fruit and Vegetables, Floriculture and Culinary), but wherever possible, Entry Forms, payment of entry monies and collection of Entry Tickets should have been completed previously, with only the delivery of the items taking place on the Friday morning.
7. Judging, except Photography and Fine Arts, will commence 9.00am on Friday 1st September 2017.
8. Stewards have the right to make special classes not listed in the Schedule if entries warrant this.
9. If the Judge considers an exhibit of insufficient merit, no award will be given.
10. Vouchers/trophies may be substituted for cash prizes at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
11. All exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
12. To determine Most Points in Sections: 1st - 2 points, 2nd - 1 point.
13. No exhibit shall be removed from the Pavilion before **4.00pm Saturday 2nd September 2017** without the permission of the Secretary or Chief Hall Steward.

DOLLY VARDEN CAKE

Ingredients:

3 eggs	1 tabspn golden syrup
1 cup sugar	1 cup mixed fruit
¼ pound (125g) butter	1 teaspn spice
½ cup milk	1 teaspn cinnamon
2 cups self raising flour	1 dsrtspn coffee essence (optional)

Method:

Cream butter and sugar.

Add eggs, one at a time. Beat well.

Add flour and milk alternately.

Put half the mixture in a 7 inch (17.5cms) sandwich tin.

To the other half of the mixture, add the syrup, fruit, spice, cinnamon and coffee essence (if used).

Place this half of the mixture in a second tin of the same size.

Bake in a moderate oven 20 to 25 minutes. Cool.

Place second half on top of plain half, join cakes with lemon icing.

Ice top with lemon icing also.

MAIDS OF HONOR TARTLETS

Shortcrust Pastry Ingredients:

3 ounces (90g) butter	¼ cup caster sugar	1 egg
1½ cups plain flour	1 dsrtspn water	

Cake Ingredients;

2 ounces (60g) butter	¼ cup caster sugar	1 egg
½ cup self raising flour	¼ teaspn vanilla	1 dsrtspn milk

Method:

Shortcrust Pastry - Sieve flour. Rub butter lightly into flour until mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in sugar. Beat egg and water together, then add to flour mixture. Mix together until a ball of dough is formed. Roll out. Cut rounds to fit tartlet tins. (Keep pastry bits)

Cake - Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add beaten egg and water, a little at a time, beating well. Add vanilla. Fold in sieved flour.

To bake - Place a little raspberry jam into each unbaked case. Put in a teaspn of cake mixture. Top with a pastry cross (cut from remaining pastry). Bake in a moderate oven for 15 minutes.
